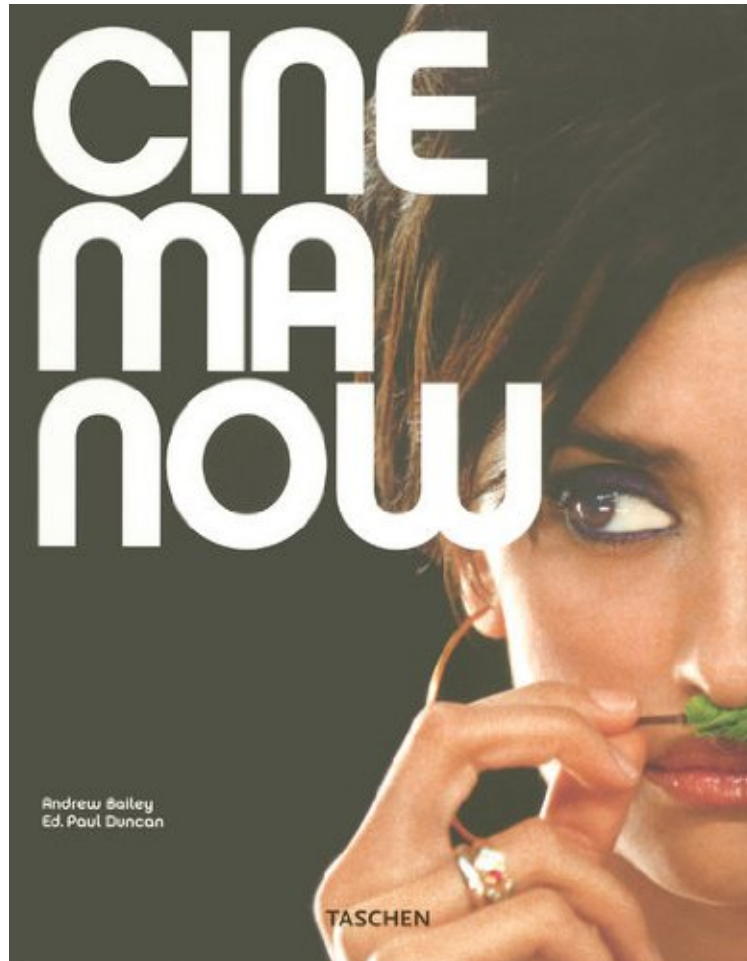

It doesn't matter if they're hardcovers or "flexible covers" as they call them. The binding, printing, paper, photography and editing are everything a book lover could want. I get a sensual pleasure just from hefting them, turning their glossy pages, inhaling their inky, bookish scent. I have many of their cinema and art books and have never bought one that disappointed me, but "Cinema Now" stands out as superior because it will introduce even cinema-savvy readers to directors they probably don't know, and that alone is worth the price, as any cinephile looking for unexplored territory will understand. Its other virtues - outstanding photos reproduced on the finest paper with the best production values - has many of the same qualities I look for in films. Unlike some of Taschen's film titles, this is a fat, hefty book with some meaty and informative text, although as

always, it is image oriented, not a deep analysis. You can buy many of these Taschen titles at unbelievably discount prices for the quality of the books.
