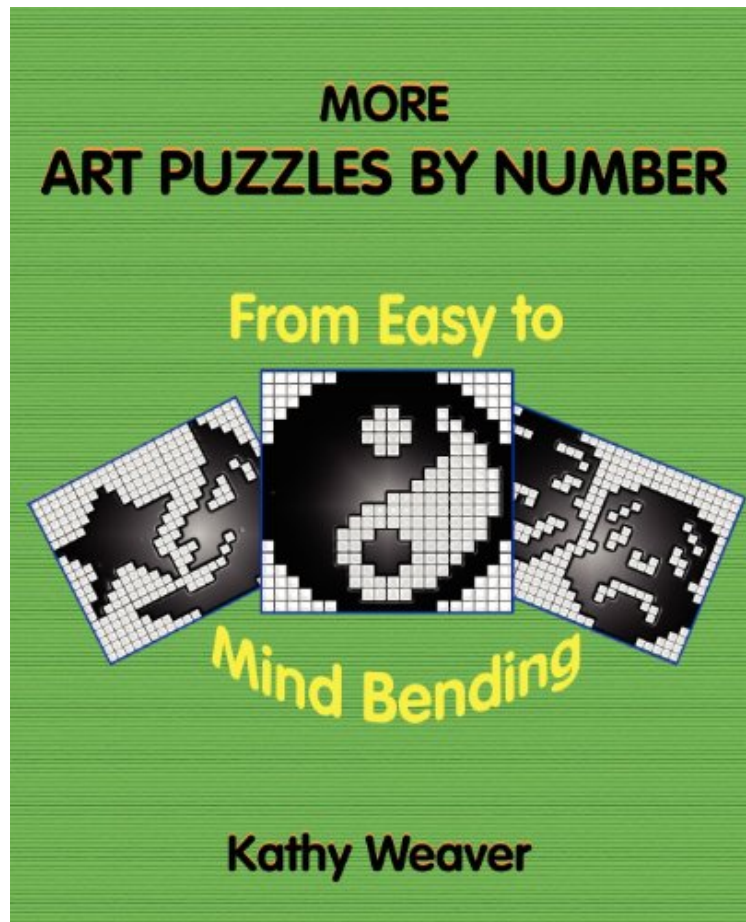

As a relative newcomer, I was concerned that I would get out of my league with the mindbenders, but I suffered no pain. More experienced solvers would agree that the puzzles are all manageable, without causing too much angst. I can imagine that they may be a bit easy for the

experts. But I think they are challenging enough for the average person. I really liked the range of pictures - with some of the other books, if I see any more people playing different sports with different balls, I'll scream! Or trains. Or trucks. Or smile faces. Of course, the easier ones here too are a bit giddy, but the more complicated ones produce some very pleasing images. I agree that this author does use symmetry a lot. Try DJape if you want to be challenged by asymmetrical images and groovy pics. This book is good for people who need decent sized squares on their grid.
